### Assignment Description

IFC is seeking consulting services to assist in design of an open season process for a fully commercial, FSU-based LNG terminal to be situated within the port of Freetown, Sierra Leone. Expressions of Interest are strictly limited to 10 pages submitted in a single pdf file. EOIs of more than 10 pages will be discarded. The prospective project is conceived of as a break-bulk facility comprising an FSU and a simple spread mooring system, located in one of two possible anchorages in Freetown harbor. The terminal would receive full-size cargos from the global market, and re-load smaller vessels and ISO containers. The market for LNG in West Africa (between Mauritania and Cote d'Ivoire) comprises independent power producers, utilities, mines, and other industries. The terminal might offer both a firm re-load service and a firm LNG service (in the re-load service scenario, the customer would be responsible for acquiring LNG supply and having it delivered in bulk to the terminal). As with other multi-user LNG terminals that allocate capacity via open seasons, the Freetown terminal would need to have systems in place for the borrowing and lending of LNG among the customers. Full details of the scope of services will be available in the RFP. At this point, interested firms are asked to provide details of their commercial LNG experience with a particular emphasis on multi-user terminals and on open seasons. EOIs should be 10 pages or less, provided in a single pdf file; very short, one paragraph bios of key personnel should be included, not cv's. Customers of the terminal might include mines, power generators, energy logistics firms, portfolio supply companies, independent commodity traders, and industrial companies. The selected consultant will work with IFC to identify potential users of the terminal and to tailor an open season process to the requirements of these potential users.
