# ASSIGNMENT DESCRIPTION

The primary focus of this assignment is to promote the introduction of market discipline to the Somalia's power sector and to create favorable investment climate for private sector participation in power sector development in the country by developing the Electricity Act for Somalia.

The Ministry of Energy and Water Resources (MoEWR) of the Federal Government of Somalia intends to develop an Electrical Energy Act to make it compliant with best international practice and ensure thorough consultation process with all stakeholders. The WBG through Somalia Unlocking Sectoral Investment Program (SUSIP) will provide support to address these challenges in the electricity sector.
